Latest Board Decisions

Joint RPA/ROPEX Board meetings were held on June 29 for all incoming and outgoing Board members and on August 13 with the new Board. While our CD principle and interest income still totals approximately \$20,000, a number of decisions were made in light of the continuing deficit gap between membership dues and yearly RPA club operating expenses:

1. Effective with this coming 2009-10 season, a discounted family membership will be offered to encourage more people to join the club. Dues will be \$20 for the first person and \$5 for every additional member residing at the same address. Only one club newsletter will be sent per address. All family members will have voting privileges. Such memberships will count towards life memberships when dues are paid for 25 consecutive years.

2. There will be no dues increase for the foreseeable future, but cuts will need to be made in other areas to ensure fiscal stability.

3. Membership meetings will be held only on the second Thursday during the months of November through February. We have been on this schedule already during November and December for several years due to the holidays. This is expanding to January and February due to lower attendance during these months because of weather conditions and snow-birds wintering down south.

4. RPA meetings will be held in the downstairs hall rather than the upstairs hall, except for everyone-a-dealer nights and other evenings when more than 30 members are expected.

5. Silent auction lot forms will be sold for 10 cents each and may be reused for the same lot until the item is sold. Money goes to the club.

6. Unanimous vote to appoint Frank Tritto to fill Joe Dole's remaining Board term through June.

Year-Start RPA Banquet Planned

The first RPA meeting on Thursday, October 8 will be our annual banquet at the Morningstar Restaurant, 850 Merchants Road. Tickets are \$17 per person in advance and \$20 at the door. The meal consists of soup, salad, choice of entrees (chicken parmesan or pork chops), dessert and beverage. Those so inclined may also bring their own bottle. Tickets may be purchased at the first two RPA meetings of the season, or by mail when sending payment to Ray Stone.

Rochester's Multipost Connection



1910 Multipost coil: type TD 37, perf 9.75, red, with full shading lines



Coil stamps issued by the U.S. Post Office Department date back to 1908 to serve the needs of commercial mass mailers. But these businesses also needed a way to quickly adhere the stamps to their envelopes. New companies formed to meet the challenge, including one from Rochester, the Multipost Company.

Pictured here is the handheld Multipost Stamp Affixer and Accountant, Model 1, patented in 1911 and sold from 1910-1940, along with the first type of dummy stamps they created to demonstrate and promote the product.

Two ads placed in prominent publications of the era are seen here. It is unknown how much the device originally sold for. Security was one of its main selling points, as the device recorded the number of stamps it affixed and its locking mechanism at the rear prevented stamps from being purloined by unscrupulous employees.

Note that the 1913 ad says over 10,000 were in use by that time. By 1914 the company also moved to Allen St., probably to a larger facility.

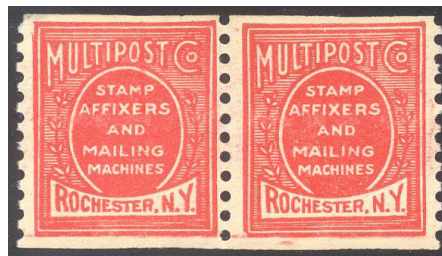
THE MULTIPOST DOES IT ALL IN ONE STROKE



Shown here is the 1922 SX model and worked the same way as its predecessors. A small reservoir was first filled with water (seen at the lower left of the 1911 model). The coil stamps were loaded in the upper round chamber. The device was placed on the envelope, a drop of water moistened the spot and the plunger was pushed down, advancing a stamp, pressing it into place.



Getting perfectly cut copies out of the affixer was a challenge, but this provides evidence when seeking postally used stamped examples on cover.



Type TD 38, perf 10.25, carmine, with short shading lines

By the 1930s Multipost became heavily involved in producing meter machines. The National Postal Meter Company of Rochester bought Multipost Company in 1941. That company became the Commercial Controls Corporation in 1944, formed by former IBM employees. Friden bought out Commercial Controls in the late 1950's.

All of these changes are noted on dummy stamps produced over the years by the succeeding companies.

Does any member remember these “stamps”? Just an FYI... The stamp affixers were both offered on eBay in the last few months. The 1911 model was priced at \$125, the 1922 SX model was \$50. I was also able to purchase a TD37 very fine pair for only \$10 on eBay!

Another Rochester Error



Errors connected with the Rochester area have been featured in the last few issues of Hinges & Tongs and here's another, about 70 years old or so.

This is Scott #810, the 5 cent Prexie with an unlisted doubling of the double-line electro precancel from Rochester. The normal version is listed in the Precancel Stamp Society catalog as type 247 with a value of 5 cents in the 1985 4th edition. It sold on eBay for \$133.50 in May!

Unique Worldwide Issues



OK, so this highlighted issue is a bit “tongue in

cheek,” but deserves recognition none-the-less. Maybe it should be “tong in cheek.”

Worldwide collectors will recognize this as a Machin definitive from Great Britain. The design has been around since 1967, surviving the decimal currency changeover and countless Prime Ministers. Hundreds of varieties exist in various denominations, colors perfs, and taggings.

But this new issue is different. It bears two elliptical die cut lozenges to prevent re-use. Look closely at the one around the denomination and the other under the Queen's nape. When soaked (yes, they can actually separate from an envelope) you'll have three pieces—the two lozenges and a piece of paper with two holes in it!
