






Censored "Win the War" first day cover mailed to Greenland.



Mail from one Japanese Internment camp to another.








Re-addressed mail to Honolulu Immigration Station 8.




Location of Hawaii's 15 month WW2 internment camp.








Censored cover sent to Alien Enemy Internment camp.





Two covers mailed to secret "atomic" PO box addresses.




Sent to Jewish Internment Camp. Note "German Written."




One of several temporary detention camps run by the Department of Justice for mostly German and Italian national POWs and enemies of the state.

Ellis Island cover - lawyer to a detained immigrant.




Mailed to a German POW housed at the Huntsville, TX camp.




To a prisoner at the Federal Penitentiary in Lewisburg, PA.



Military deserter and "accidentally killed" covers.








Brooklyn, NY transit mark Archangel, Russia censor

Merchant Marine mail, Russian Arctic.






U.S. Customs censor on reverse
